PLEASE FOLLOW THE PUBLICATION GUIDELINES OUTLINED BELOW

1. Format

Please send your paper in electronic form to our editor (e-mail redaktion.wpb@wko.at) or on a CD/diskette by post. Save your document in a format compatible with MS Word for Windows (preferably MS Word 97-2003). If you work with Apple Macintosh, be sure to convert your document into a MS Word for Windows compatible version. If your paper contains graphs or figures, save these separately from the text document and send them both as an electronic file and as a hard copy. The length of an article should not exceed 25.000 – 30.000 characters unless otherwise agreed with the editor.

2. Abstract

Please include a short description (max. 1000 characters) of the content (summary) of your paper under the title. The title and this summary is included in the catalogue of the Journal of Economic Literature. Be sure to append the appropriate JEL-code to your article. A list of the codes can be found at http://www.aeaweb.org/journal/jel_class_system.html.

3. Text

Titles:

When using titles and subtitles use the following format:

- 1. Example Top Level Titel**
- 1.1. Example First Subtitel
- 1.2.1. *Example Second Subtitel*

Use the following order in marking subtitles:

bold/spaces/*italic*

Book or article titles

in italic, no quotation marks

4. Quotes or citations

in the text

- (author/author, year, page)
- (author, year; author, year)
- (newspaper or journal, year)

no "see below" or "page"

In the references or bibliography

Books:

- author's surname, first initial (year), title, place.
- first author's surname, first initial/second author's surname, first initial/
third author's surname, first initial (year), title, place.
- institutions are treated as single authors
- if more than one publication of the same year by the same
author are quoted, please distinguish by using a, b, c after the year

Article in a book:

- author's surname, first initial (year), title of article,
in: editor(s)'s surname(s), page no.

- in alphabetical order:
editor's surname, first initial, ed., (year), title, place. Example 2e

Article in a periodical:

- author's surname, first initial (year), title of article,
periodical number, page. Example 2f

Article in a newspaper:

- author's surname, first initial (year), title of article,
newspaper or journal title (exact date), page. Example 2g
- when no author is named:
newspaper or journal title (exact date), title of article, page. Example 2h

Quotation from the internet:

- Following the MLA-style (<http://www.tsufl.edu/library/5/mla.htm>),
in addition quote also URL and date of access Example 2i

In the *references*, indent consecutive lines. Full stop after every quote!

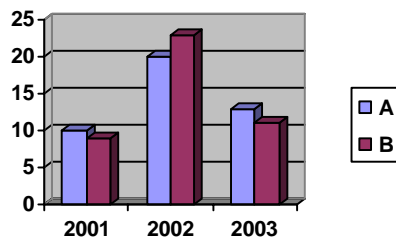
6. Tables and Figures
