Position paper on EuRIC's reaction to the Net Zero Industry Act

EuRIC is in alignment with the Commission's view on the **importance of improving** the **investment environment** for the Union's **manufacturing capacity of technologies**. Press release calling for a CRM Regulation that promotes circularity in Europe

European recyclers warn of a plethora of poorly justified proposed amendments found in ITRE's draft report on the EU COM proposal on Critical Raw Materials. While many tabled proposals highlight the need for transparency, others propose the addition of materials to the annexes without the existence of such argumentation. European recyclers strongly believe that any proposal in EU legislation must be backed up by an assessment based purely on scientific evidence.



Press release on EuRIC support for the Czech proposal to lower VAT for products with recycled content

EuRIC warmly welcomes the proposal made by the Czech Republic to the Council to explore lower VAT rates for products made of recycled materials and recyclates. Replacing extracted raw materials with recycled materials brings significant and well-documented environmental benefits, both in terms of resource efficiency and climate and energy savings. These environmental benefits are not internalized in prices, although they are often the most important factor in consumers' choices and public procurement.

After previous careful consideration among all jurors, the names of the most outstanding awareness-raising actions on waste reduction were revealed during the ceremony. EuRIC congratulates all winners & finalists!

She shared the views of the textile reuse and recycling industry about EPR schemes and highlighted that the ecomodulation of fees must be aligned with the ESPR and that representatives from the end-of-life phase must be represented in the administration of an EPR scheme.

From the Waste Shipment Regulation to the Ecodesign for Sustainable Products Regulation, the Waste Framework Directive, and many other topics, the day's agenda was packed, and fruitful discussions took place. EuRIC visited the Comet Group recycling plant in Obourg

On 9 June, Emmanuel Katrakis, Secretary General, and Florence le Levreur, Communication advisor, visited the Obourg recycling site. The visit provided an opportunity to discover the entire **COMET Group** ecosystem and its many research and development activities notably the Multipick robotised sorting unit.



1. Design circular we aim at improving circularity in the design and produce vehicles.
2. Use recycled content: we want to increase the use of recycled content manufacturing of new vehicles.
3. Treat better: we aim to increase the quantity AND QUALITY of material used, remanufactured, and recycled.
4. Improve governance: we want to reinforce producer responsibility by national Extended Producer Responsibility Schemes.
5. Collect more: we aim to increase traceability with regard to the trade a vehicles.
6. Cover all vehicles: we want to extend the regulatory scope to motorcy and buses.

On 22 June, EuRIC Secretary General Emmanuel Katrakis spoke at the **IARC**, the international platform for discussing the latest developments and challenges in the circular economy and automotive recycling. Along with representatives from across the value chain, he participated in a panel discussion on the implications of the upcoming ELV revision for the industry and other stakeholders.





Public consultation on WEEE

European Commission opens **public consultation on waste from electrical and electronic equipment from 16 June 2023 until 22 September 2023** (midnight Brussels time). The public consultation aims to gather evidence and feedback from a wide range of stakeholders who have had a role in implementing the WEEE Directive and/or otherwise engaged by its targets and objectives.

Plastic Treaty

On 16 June, the Council of EU published a **note on information** from Presidency and Commission on the second session of the Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee to develop an international legally binding instrument on plastic pollution by the end of 2024. This high-level meeting organized by the United Nations took place in Paris from 29 May to 2 June.



Spain assumes the Presidency in the second half of 2023, from 1 July to 31 December. The Spanish Presidency has established **four priorities** for its semester:

- 1. Reindustrialise the EU and ensure its open strategic autonomy
- 2. Advance in the green transition and the environmental adaptation
- 3. Promoting greater social and economic justice
- 4. Strengthening European unity



The European Commission published the "Waste Early Warning Report" identifying Member States at risk of not meeting the 2025 preparing for re-use and recycling target for municipal waste, the 2025 recycling target for packaging waste, and the 2035 municipal waste landfilling reduction target. Nine Member States are on track to meet the 2025 targets: Austria, Belgium, Czechia, Denmark, Germany, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands and Slovenia.

The project partners were able to present their project results as well as introduce the cluster and upcoming joint activities to the visitors. In addition, members of the cluster spoke at various sessions of the conference. Maria Vera from EuRIC took part in an industry debate on the use of recycled plastics in packaging.



ABSolEU project

Alejandro Navazas, EuRIC Scientific and Policy Advisor participated in the 3rd Project Meeting of **ABSolEU Project** in Gothenburg (Sweden). EuRIC is part of the Advisory Board of this project which is an initiative funded under the EU's Horizon Europe Programme. It is simultaneously a multilateral collaboration that **aims to pave the way to circularity for the ubiquitous plastic ABS**, found in durable products from toys and other consumer goods to automotive components, and therefore revolutionise the current state of the art of ABS recycling in Europe and beyond.
