We will continue brainstorming and fine-tuning ideas in collaboration with Presidency and Board.

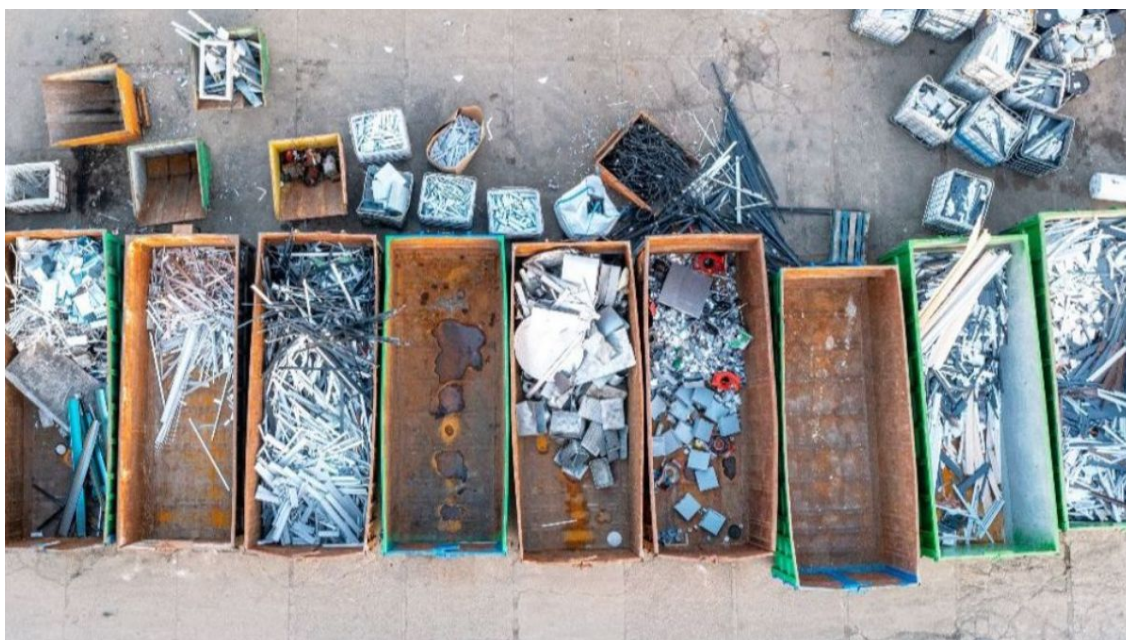

## Director of DG Environment visits EuRIC member recycling facility

EuRIC had the privilege to welcome the Director of the DG Environment in charge of circular economy, Mr Aurel Ciobanu-Dordea, to visit a prominent recycling facility of one of its member companies, Galloo.

The site visit was an opportunity to showcase recycling in action by demonstrating how old metal appliances can be turned into high-quality recycled metals and plastics.

The recycling facility in Menan, Belgium, just across the border with France, is a leading specialist in recycling metals, WEEE and ELVs. EuRIC is grateful to Mr Ciobanu-Dordea for his time and the constructive discussions.



## Pivotal European Parliament vote on Waste Shipment Regulation

The European Parliament has adopted its resolution on the Waste Shipment Regulation. This plenary vote follows a vote by members of the Environment Committee's (ENVI) of the rapporteur's report on 1 December. The consolidated version of the European Parliament

Reacting in a press release (see below), EuRIC applauded the establishment of **mandatory recycled content targets for plastics** but regretted the failure to adopt targets for **metals** and **paper**. EuRIC condemned the **one-size-fits-all** approach to exports which means that the same restrictions apply to **low-quality mixed plastic waste** as to **high-value raw materials from recycling**.

In a separate letter (see below), EuRIC also specifically addressed the ban on plastic waste exports calling for five concrete actions that will facilitate, rather than impede, the recycling of plastic waste. ## Clothing reuse has a 70 times lower environmental impact reveals new study

A **new life-cycle assessment (LCA)** commissioned by the EuRIC Textiles branch has confirmed the significant **CO<sub>2</sub>** and **water** savings of reusing textiles compared to producing new clothing. The study revealed that the environmental impact of reusing textiles is **70**

More specifically, the study revealed that a massive **3kg of CO<sub>2</sub>** is saved for each high/medium-quality clothing that is reused. While only a mere **0.01%** of the water used to produce new clothing is required for reuse. This study also emphasised the importance of recycling, in particular its potential to tackle the rising amounts of low-quality and non-reusable clothing.

## PAHs assessment back on the table for recycled rubber

PAHs in recycled rubber are once again under scrutiny by EU legislators. The European Commission has made a formal request to the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) to reassess the risks to children from PAHs in granules and mulches in playgrounds and other domestic applications such as gardening and landscaping. This is contrary to a final decision made on 21 July 2021 setting a concentration of 20 ppm for the sum of the 8

An initial screening assessment of risks will be sent to the Commission by the end of February 2023. If uncontrolled risks are identified, a proposal for restrictions may be prepared.

## Tyre recycling: making the wheel go round from an environmental and policy perspective

Currently, 95% of the end-of-life tyres (ELT) in the EU are collected and treated thanks to the development of good management systems for waste tyres, mainly dominated by EPR schemes, and investments in recycling. However, over the last two decades, policies focusing on enhancing the circularity of raw materials from ELT (i.e., rubber, steel, textiles and carbon black) have been scarce.

There is a lot of untapped potential for circularity as for each tyre that gets incinerated with energy recovery, there is one tyre that gets mechanically recycled. However, tyre recycling heads into 2023 with serious challenges in which the rubber end-market applications face different bans:

- A restriction on the intentional use of synthetic polymer microparticles affecting 30% of the tyre recycling market
- A restriction on the content of PAHs and other chemicals affecting 70% of the tyre recycling market

Under this scenario, policy actions are required on all the different steps of the tyre value chain – from tyre design, collection and sorting, and recycling, to the uptake of recycled materials. ## EU POLICY & REGULATORY UPDATES



### EU legislative agenda 2023

The EU institutions (Commission, Parliament and Council) have signed a Joint Declaration on the EU Legislative Priorities for the years 2023-2024. The Declaration is linked to the Commission's 2023 Work Programme and focuses on key legislative proposals.

The European Green Deal tops the list of priorities, including several legislative dossiers under its umbrella, including reducing water, air and microplastic pollution, the fight against environmental crime and soil health. The European Commission has also published the draft agenda of the weekly meetings of the College of Commissioners until June. The legislative text on critical raw materials is scheduled for 14 March, on microplastics for 17 May and on the right to repair for 31 May. Notably, crucial initiatives such as the revision of the Waste Framework Directive (WFD) and the soil health legislation are missing from Q1, while the revision of the REACH regulation is not on the agenda.

## Eco-design for sustainable products (ESPR)

European Parliament [publishes](#) Committee on Environment, Public Health and Food Safety's amendments to draft report on Ecodesign for the Sustainable Products Regulation.

## Due Diligence

Almost [1500 amendments](#) were put forward to the draft report on the European Commission's Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence Directive proposal. The vote on the draft report and tabled amendments is scheduled for 13 March 2023.

## Batteries

The Council of EU has [published](#) a letter to the Chair of the European Parliament Committee on Environment on the outcome of proceedings about the proposal for a Batteries and Battery Waste Regulation.

## Waste Framework Directive
